## **Mortgage Industry Data Standards**

## ABSTRACT

Vast amounts of data are collected and exchanged for mortgages originated in the United States. This presentation will review efforts to standardize mortgage data in the origination and automated underwriting of loans and in the issuance of mortgage-backed securities. The presentation will give an overview of how Freddie Mac and Fannie Mae, which guarantee more than \$5 trillion of mortgages, support adoption of the MISMO standard by the mortgage industry.

He has been a speaker on eMortgage topics at CampusMBA® educational seminars and a frequent panelist at the MBA Technology In Mortgage Banking Conferences. In March 2005, he was recognized by Mortgage Banking Magazine as a "Mortgage IT All-Star" and again in 2009 as a "Twice-Honored All-Star."
