The 9<sup>th</sup> International Conference on Information Quality (ICIQ-04) will be held at MIT from November 5 (Friday, 5-6:30 p.m.) to November 7 (Sunday noon), 2004.

The annual *International Conference on Information Quality* provides a forum for both researchers and practitioners to exchange IQ knowledge and ideas. Practitioners and researchers present findings and experience related to topics such as IQ concepts, tools, measures, models and management; case studies; best practices, cost/benefit analysis, IQ and data warehousing, IQ and e-business, policies and standards. Participants must complete both on-line registration and pay registration fee by Sept. 8, 2004 (**VERY FIRM**) to qualify for early registration.
